
Announced by Honourable Prime Minister, Andrew Holness ON PC, the National Theme for Labour Day 2023 was 'Plant a Tree for Life -Promoting Climate Change Mitigation, Food Security and Road Safety". Accordingly, JBM's main project, in partnership with the Forestry Department was the Beulah Park Tree Planting Initiative in Golden Grove, St. Ann, which saw over 200 trees being planted in community owned by Jamaica Bauxite Mining.

Led by Managing Director, Mrs. Donna Marie Howe this initiative was supported by Sophia Gooden Morris, Client Services & Forest Technician and Patrick Barrett, Forester of the Forestry Department, who ably provided guidance in the planting and offered tips on the maintenance of the trees planted.
